# THAR – MUSIC THEATRE PERFORMANCE

# THAR 101

### Acting I

#### 3 Credits Total (0-5-0)

In Acting I, students develop fundamental acting skills through solo and ensemble exercises. Then, students analyze, rehearse and perform modern and/or contemporary theatrical texts. They also explore foundational actor movement exercises to provide a basis for character and physical theatre work.

Co-requisites: THAR 104 and THAR 110.

# THAR 104

# Voice I

3 Credits (1-2.5-1.5)

In Voice I, students develop fundamental vocal skills required for music theatre performers. Students take weekly group classes in speech, singing and musical theatre history. In addition, students build their skills through one-on-one private lessons with personal voice teachers. Course content includes modern/contemporary monologues and solos from musical theatre repertoire.

Co-requisites: THAR 101 and THAR 110.

# THAR 105 Play Analysis

### 3 Credits Weekly (3-0-0)

In this course, students analyze plays from a variety of historical periods. Students explore the fundamentals of play analysis, including dramatic structure, plot, theme, character, and performance elements. Students also examine how these works reflected, intersected with and influenced society. In addition, students attend and analyze at least one professional production during the course. Note: Credit can be obtained in only one of THAR 105 or DRMA 102.

### THAR 110

#### Dance I

### 3 Credits Weekly (0-4-0)

In Dance I, students develop fundamental dance techniques required for music theatre performers. Students take regular classes in ballet, jazz and tap to establish a foundational dance vocabulary. Students also engage in basic physical conditioning exercises. *Co-requisites: THAR 101 and THAR 104.* 

#### **THAR 140**

#### Music Theory and Ear Training I

3 Credits Weekly (1.5-1.5-0)

In this course, students explore fundamental music theory and ear training concepts for music theatre performers. Students also apply these concepts to the analysis and performance of musical theatre repertoire. Topics include notation, scales, intervals, chords, rhythms, melodic and harmonic analysis, aural identification, transcription, sightsinging and keyboard skills.

### **THAR 141**

#### Music Theory and Ear Training II 3 Credits Weekly (1.5-1.5-0)

In this course, students continue to explore fundamental music theory and ear training concepts for music theatre performers. Coursework focuses on the relationship between music theory, ear training and the performance of musical theatre repertoire.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 140.

### THAR 149

#### Introduction to Acting 3 Credits Weekly (0-5-0)

This course is designed for students with little or no previous experience in theatre and therefore introduces students to the process of acting. Students develop fundamental skills in acting, voice and movement through solo and ensemble exercises. Then students apply their skills to performance projects. Note: This course may not be taken for credit if credit has been obtained in DRMA 149.

### **THAR 151**

#### Acting II

#### 3 Credits Weekly (0-5-0)

In Acting II, students continue to develop fundamental acting skills through scene study work. Students analyze, research, rehearse and perform scenes from modern and/or contemporary plays. They also continue to take movement classes, with a focus on expanding their movement vocabularies and partnering skills.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 101.

Co-requisites: THAR 154 and THAR 160.

### THAR 154

### Voice II

#### 3 Credits Weekly (1-2.5-1.5)

In Voice II, students continue to develop fundamental vocal skills required for music theatre performers. Students take weekly group classes in speech, singing and musical theatre history. In addition, students build their skills through one-on-one private lessons with personal voice teachers. Course content includes monologues, scene excerpts, solos and duets.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 104. Co-requisites: THAR 151 and THAR 160.

## THAR 160

# Dance II

#### 3 Credits Weekly (0-4-0)

In Dance II, students continue to develop fundamental dance techniques required for music theatre performers. Students take regular classes in ballet, jazz and tap, and integrate dance techniques into basic choreography. In addition, students further engage in physical conditioning exercises.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 110. Co-requisites: THAR 151 and THAR 154.

### THAR 201 Acting III 3 Credits (0-6-0)

Acting III builds on the skills developed in Acting I and II. Focus shifts from process to performance as students analyze, research, rehearse and perform a play. Students also continue to take movement classes, with an emphasis on character movement techniques.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 151.

Co-requisites: THAR 204 and THAR 250.

#### THAR 204 Voice III

# 3 Credits (1-2.5-1.5)

In Voice III, students develop intermediate-level vocal skills required for music theatre performers. Students continue to take weekly group classes in speech, singing and musical theatre history, as well as one-onone private voice lessons. Course content focuses on the integration of voice, acting and movement work.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 154. Co-requisites: THAR 201 and THAR 250.

### **THAR 240**

### Music Theory and Ear Training III

### 3 Credits Weekly (1.5-1.5-0)

In this course, students explore intermediate-level music theory and ear training concepts for music theatre performers. Students further examine the relationship between music theory, ear training and the performance of musical theatre repertoire.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 141.

#### THAR 241

# Music Theory and Ear Training IV

### 3 Credits Weekly (1.5-1.5-0)

This is the final course of music theory and ear training for music theatre performers. Students explore intermediate/advanced-level music theory and ear training concepts and apply these concepts to practical projects. *Prerequisites: THAR 240.* 

#### **THAR 247**

#### Introduction to Oral Communication 3 Credits Weekly (0-5-0)

#### 3 Credits Weekly (U-5-U)

This course helps students become more effective and embodied speakers. Students explore fundamental vocal and physical techniques used in oral communication. Then students apply these techniques to different types of oral communication, from public speaking (speeches, lectures, etc.) to drama (monologues, reader's theatre, etc.). In addition, students investigate the uses of oral communication skills in a variety of careers. The course culminates in practical public speaking and/or dramatic projects. Note: This course may not be taken for credit if credit has been obtained in DRMA 247.

### **THAR 250**

### Dance III

3 Credits Weekly (0-6-0)

Dance III builds on the skills developed in Dance I and II. Students continue to take regular dance technique classes in ballet, jazz and tap. Students also analyze and perform the work of seminal musical theatre choreographers.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 160. Co-requisites: THAR 201 and THAR 204.

### THAR 251 Acting IV 3 Credits

**3 Credits** (0-6-0) Acting IV builds on the skills developed in Acting III. Students engage in a deeper exploration of performance techniques with a production from the musical theatre repertoire. Students also continue to develop their physical skills, focusing on dance and/or movement within a musical

production context. Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 201. Co-requisites: THAR 254 and THAR 260.

#### **THAR 254**

### Voice IV

#### 3 Credits (1-2.5-1.5)

In Voice IV, students continue to develop intermediate-level vocal skills required for music theatre performers. Students take weekly group classes in speech, singing and musical theatre history, as well as one-on-one private voice lessons. Course content includes chorus text work and ensemble singing.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 204. Co-requisites: THAR 251 and THAR 260.

#### THAR 260 Dance IV

### 3 Credits Weekly (0-6-0)

Dance IV builds on the skills developed in Dance I-III. Students continue to take regular classes in ballet, jazz and tap. They also integrate dance techniques and performance skills into increasingly complex ensemble choreography.

*Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 250. Co-requisites: THAR 251 and THAR 254.* 

### **THAR 301**

### Acting V

#### 3 Credits (0-5-0)

In Acting V, students explore the demands of heightened text and movement through classical monologue and/or scene study. They also explore specialized movement techniques.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 251.

Co-requisites: THAR 304 and THAR 350.

### **THAR 304**

# Voice V

### 3 Credits (0-2.5-1.5)

In Voice V, students develop advanced-level vocal skills required for music theatre performers. Students take weekly group classes in speech and singing with a focus on heightened text and sound production. Students also continue to build their skills through one-on-one private voice lessons. Course content includes classical texts and advanced-level musical theatre repertoire.

*Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 254. Co-requisites: THAR 301 and THAR 350.* 

## THAR 350

### Dance V

### 3 Credits Weekly (0-6-0)

In Dance V, students continue to develop their jazz dance skills through regular technique classes. They also explore specialized styles of dance used in musical theatre performance.

*Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 260. Co-requisites: THAR 301 and THAR 304.* 

# THAR 351

#### Acting VI

### 3 Credits (0-5-0)

In Acting VI, students apply advanced-level performance skills to contemporary musical theatre repertoire. They also explore specialized dance and/or movement techniques.

*Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 301. Co-requisites: THAR 354 and THAR 360.* 

### **THAR 354**

#### Voice VI

3 Credits (0-2.5-1.5)

In Voice VI, students continue to develop advanced-level vocal skills required for music theatre performers. Students take weekly group classes in speech and singing with a focus on the dialect/accent work, International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) and contemporary/pop/rock repertoire. Students also continue to build their skills through one-on-one private lessons.

*Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 304. Co-requisites: THAR 351 and THAR 360.* 

### THAR 360 Dance VI

### 3 Credits Weekly (0-6-0)

In Dance VI, students continue to develop their jazz dance skills through regular technique classes. They also further explore specialized styles of dance used in musical theatre performance.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 260.

Co-requisites: THAR 351 and THAR 354.

# **THAR 401**

# Acting VII

# 3 Credits Weekly (0-5-0)

In Acting VII, students develop the essential skills required for acting on camera. They also apply advanced-level performance skills to on-camera monologues and/or scenes.

Prerequisites: THAR 351.

Co-requisites: THAR 404 and THAR 440.

#### **THAR 404**

#### Voice VII

#### 1.5 Credits (0-2-1)

In Voice VII, students continue to develop advanced-level vocal skills through weekly group voice classes and one-on-one private voice lessons. Students also expand their skills by exploring specialized industry-specific areas of voice work.

Prerequisites: THAR 354.

Co-requisites: THAR 401 and THAR 440.

### **THAR 440**

#### Dance VII

### 1.5 Credits Weekly (0-2-0)

In Dance VII, students continue to finesse their dance skills through ongoing technique classes. They also explore methods for creating new dance and/or movement works. *Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 360.* 

Co-requisites: THAR 401 and THAR 404.

# THAR 450

### Performance I

### 3 Credits Total (0-0-200)

In Performance I, students develop and perform a role in a musical or play in the Department of Theatre's season. Through the production process, they refine their performance skills, cultivate professional etiquette, and collaborate with the creative team, fellow actors and technical staff/crew. *Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 251, THAR 254, and THAR 260.* 

#### THAR 451 Acting VIII

### 3 Credits Weekly (0-5-0)

In Acting VIII, students prepare to transition from university to the profession. They explore career management tools and learn how to engage in professional auditions.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 401. Co-requisites: THAR 454 and THAR 461.

### **THAR 454**

#### Voice VIII

#### 1.5 Credits weekly (0-2-1)

In Voice VIII, students continue to develop advanced-level vocal skills through weekly voice classes and one-on-one private voice lessons. Students also rehearse and perform original and/or existing material for cabaret performance.

*Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 404. Co-requisites: THAR 451 and THAR 461.* 

# THAR 460

# Performance II

### 3 Credits Total (0-0-200)

In Performance II, students develop and perform a role in a musical or play in the Department of Theatre's season. Through the production process, they refine their performance skills, cultivate professional etiquette, and collaborate with the creative team, fellow actors and technical staff/crew.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 251, THAR 254, and THAR 260.

### **THAR 461**

#### Dance VIII

### 1.5 Credits Weekly (0-2-0)

In Dance VIII, students finesse their dance skills through ongoing technique classes. They also learn how to engage in professional musical theatre dance auditions.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 440.

Co-requisites: THAR 451 and THAR 454.

# THAR 470

#### Performance III 3 Credits Total (0-0-300)

In Performance III, students develop and perform a role in a musical or play in the Department of Theatre's Season. Through the production process, they refine their performance skills, cultivate professional etiquette, and collaborate with the creative team, fellow actors and technical staff/crew.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 251, THAR 254 and THAR 260.

#### THAR 480

#### Performance IV

3 Credits Total (0-0-300)

In Performance IV, students develop and perform a role in a musical or play in the Department of Theatre's Season. Through the production process, they refine their performance skills, cultivate professional etiquette, and collaborate with the creative team, fellow actors and technical staff/crew.

Prerequisites: Minimum grade of C- in THAR 251, THAR 254 and THAR 260.
